NEW COMMEMORATIVE PATCHES AND UNIFORM CHANGES FOR THE 2002 SEASON

Fans attending Major League Baseball games in the 2002 season will see changes in club logos, uniforms and the addition of commemorative patches.

Anaheim Angels: The Angels have changed their primary logo and altered their uniform for the 2002 season. The new Anaheim logo features a red, capital "A," with a gray halo around the top. The "A" sits in front of a navy blue baseball diamond, with the words "Anaheim Angels" across the top. Their home



uniforms will include white, button-down jerseys with red piping around the sleeves and "ANGELS" stitched across the front in red. The uniform number is red and located on the lower left front of the jersey and in the middle of the back, below the player's name, which is also red. The pants are white with red piping down the

outside of the legs. Their new road uniform is gray and includes a button-down jersey with "ANAHEIM" stitched in red, across the front. Red piping is around both sleeves and down the outside legs of the pants. The jersey number is located on the lower left front and on the back below the player's name. The stirrups for both uniforms are red and the hat is all red with the signature Angels' "A" on the front. Anaheim has recaptured their tradition with these uniforms as they mirror the essence of graphics from their past.

Seattle Mariners: The Mariners will celebrate their 25th season of Major League Baseball in 2002 and are wearing a uniform patch to commemorate the campaign. The patch is navy blue with silver and green trim. It is oval-shaped



with a large "25th" in the middle and the word "ANNIVERSARY" written below. The Mariners' compass rose logo crowns the patch.

Milwaukee Brewers: Miller Park in Milwaukee will be the site of the 2002 Mid-Summer Classic and to commemorate their role as host, the Brewers will post an All-Star Game patch on the right sleeve of their

uniform jerseys. The patch reads "All-Star Game," in script, with the MLB silhouetted batter logo at the bottom. It features a green canopy, which symbolizes the convertible fan-shaped roof that sits on top of the ballpark, and displays the clock, which stands at the front of Miller Park. The patch also reads "Brewers 2002" across the top.



Colorado Rockies: The Rockies will be celebrating their tenth season of Major League Baseball in 2002 and will mark the anniversary with a circular uniform patch. The patch, which features the baseball and purple mountains from Colorado's primary logo, reads, "10 YEARS" across the top and "ANNIVERSARY SEASON" around the bottom.



"COLORADO ROCKIES" is written across the middle of the patch.

Los Angeles Dodgers: In 2002, the Dodgers will wear a commemorative patch as they celebrate their

40th season of baseball at Dodger Stadium. The patch reads "DODGER STADIUM" across the middle with the years "1962-2002" beneath and "40th ANNIVERSARY" is written across a home plate below. It also features a silhouette of the stadium's top



with palm trees surrounding it and the Los Angeles skyline in the background.

New York Mets: The Mets will pay tribute to their 40 years in the National League with a uniform patch that will be displayed on the right sleeve of their home and road



jerseys. The patch, which has a green diamond backdrop, reads "Mets" in script across the front, with "40th Anniversary" written below, and the years "1962" and "2002" on the top and bottom of the diamond, respectively.

Cincinnati Reds: Cinergy Field, formerly Riverfront Stadium, will close its gates for the last time at the end of the 2002 season, as the Reds will introduce the Great American Ballpark in 2003. In honor of their



final season at Cinergy, the Reds will wear a patch on the left sleeve of their home and road uniforms. The patch features an outside section of Cinergy Field

surrounded by Cincinnati's Roebling Bridge, the PNC Bank building and Carew

Tower. The bottom of the patch displays the primary Reds logo, which is placed in the middle of the years 1970 and 2002, signifying the duration in which the Reds have played in the ballpark.

Kansas City Royals: In 2002, the Royals will undergo their first uniform change since 1992. Kansas City will wear a new black home and road alternate jersey, a new gray, sleeveless road jersey and have added black trim to their white home jersey and alternate home blue jersey.
